## Crouse Health Foundation Report to the Crouse Hospital Nurses Alumni – Fall 2017

#### With deep appreciation

In July of this year, the Pomeroy College of Nursing at Crouse Hospital received a very generous donation from the Estate of Mary Capella Redmond, RN (Crouse-Irving Hospital School of Nursing, Class of 1951). Mary bequeathed the bulk of her estate to the College to provide scholarships to deserving students, with the provision

that they be given in the name of Barbara A. Riorden, BS, RN, a 1923 graduate of our school who went on to become Interim Superintendent as well as a Nursing Arts Instructor. Mary was a native of Solvay, NY who worked as a registered nurse in Syracuse for many years, and we are in the process of learning more about her from her executor and family. In the meantime, we are pleased to share that her vision and generosity have been used to create the Mary Redmond Memorial Scholarship Fund, an endowed fund that will permanently underwrite a full scholarship in Barbara Riorden's name for at least one Pomeroy College of Nursing student every year.

#### **Pomeroy College of Nursing Scholarships**

Through the generous support of the Crouse Hospital Nurses Alumni, fourteen scholarships totaling \$7,000 were recently given to Pomeroy College of Nursing students for the 2017-2018 academic year. These awards came from investment income earned by the endowed Crouse Hospital Nurses Alumni Fund, and recipients were selected by the school based on academic achievement and financial need. In January, another eight scholarships will be awarded for the 2018 calendar year in the name of Crouse Hospital Nurses Alumni from an outright donation of \$5,000 made by the association. These "split" scholarship disbursements — academic year versus calendar year — represent the College's goal to have monies available for students entering our program in both the fall and spring semesters. Our students are deeply grateful for this meaningful support, and our heartfelt thanks go to all the alumni whose continued involvement and generosity make these awards possible.

#### **Event Updates**

- The 2017 Crouse Classic Golf Tournament was held on July 18<sup>th</sup>, netting close to \$125,000 for a new transport isolette for the Baker Regional NICU's Transport Team. We are pleased to support the special group of providers who help move babies via ground and air between 18 birthing affiliates spanning 14 counties between the Canadian and Pennsylvania borders.
- Our second annual Polo for Preemies fundraiser was held on July 30<sup>th</sup> with more than 1,000 in attendance at the Skaneateles Polo Club. Net proceeds totaled more than \$25,000 and will be used to further the work of the Baker Regional NICU.
- Ticket sales for our 41<sup>st</sup> annual Tribute Evening gala are brisk as we prepare for the October 6<sup>th</sup> event at the Oncenter in Syracuse. # Newsmakers

**Erin Zinkievich, Class of 2006**, Clinical Supervisor of the new Pomeroy Emergency Services Department at Crouse Hospital, recently offered a tour of the facility for the Alumni Newsletter. She pointed out the many innovations and wonderful advancements that have been incorporated into the design of the facility, many of which were suggested by ED staff. Some of these new features include:

- Two behavioral health rooms in which equipment can be locked away for patient and staff safety;
- An observation unit, previously located in another part of the hospital, where patients can get care quickly;
- A bereavement room;
- Two resuscitation rooms offering 360 degree access to medical equipment with a movable boom;

- A treatment room specifically designed for stroke patients;
- A bariatric treatment room with a lift that can transfer patients that weigh up to 1,000 pounds.

Erin said the staff are very excited and look forward to Phase Two of the renovation project in which Prompt Care will move into the old ED space, expected in 2018. Since its July opening, Erin said that the community-at-large has embraced the new ED facility for its comfort, quiet atmosphere and cleanliness. She gave special acknowledgment to **Charles Eaton, Class of 2000**, former Emergency Services Nurse Manager, for his significant and tireless contributions toward seeing this dream realized.

#### FOR EXTRAORDINARY NURSES

IN MEMORY OF J. PATRICK BARNES

Molly Lanza, RN, Class of 2004, Elizabeth Dablock, RN, Class of 2002 and Melisa Vadala, RN, 2013 were among the April 2017 Daisy Honorees from 8 Irving, Labor and Delivery. The mother who nominated the recipients wrote of her tragic experience — the loss of her unborn daughter on Valentine's Day, her due date, when no heartbeat could be detected on the sonogram in her obstetrician's office and shared her profound appreciation of the loving care she received. "We rushed up to Crouse and I was a mess ... Molly answered all of our questions and was just so kind as all of our family showed up... I just want everyone to know how wonderful of a job they did and how much they helped us through the worst day of our lives...You are all amazing!"

Melissa Smith, RN, Class of 2013, and Nicole Petrie, RN, Daisy Award Recipients for June, 2017, were nominated by their night charge nurse on 8 Irving, Labor and Delivery, Casey Richardson, RN, Class of 2005. Casey wrote, "I have worked at Crouse for 12 years now with a couple breaks in between ... What ultimately lead me back each time was the family that I have had the privilege of becoming a part of there. This past week, I have been on the other side of things. I was the grieving family member and not the nurse. I am h<mark>aving a hard tim</mark>e finding the right words to explain how much of a comfort everyone was to me. .. The support that I was given and the care that was provided ... reminds me of why I am so profoundly grateful to be a part of our Crouse family."

#### Alumni Recipients of The DAISY Award at Crouse Hospital include:

Trevor Tompkins, RN, Class of 2015, Daisy Award recipient for July, 2017, was nominated by his nurse manager, Colleen Phinney, RN, Class of 1983, because he is extremely committed to providing the best care to all of his patients and their families. Colleen's nomination included a particular example of Trevor's compassion and commitment. "A few weeks ago, the cloudy skies of Syracuse broke for a particularly warm and sunny spring day. A patient had been admitted a few weeks prior with a particularly grim prognosis, she was bedbound, having difficulty with pain management and it was unknown if she would ever leave the hospital, let alone ever get some fresh air and be able to feel the warm sun on her face. A suggestion was made to try and get her outside onto the Pomeroy Patient Patio. Trevor swung into action and within a short period of time, the patient, her husband, son and niece were outside, joking that the only thing that could make this better was a margarita. Despite being bedbound, on oxygen and multiple IV tubes, Trevor was able to provide a small ray of sunshine to this patient and family, both literally and figuratively. I am sure many of Trevor's coworkers could share countless other stories of how he has bettered the hospital experience for many of our patients."

Dawn Bezon, RN, Class of 2002, Daisy Award recipient for August, 2017, was nominated by a grateful mother who wrote, "Nursing is more than a job, it is a continued effort to give a piece of yourself, to show compassion, to build trust, to make a difference in the moment. Dawn is every bit or an extraordinary nurse and deserving of this award. The compassion she showed and displayed for me and my family is remarkable."

### Reflections

Helen Parker (1926-2017) graduated from Crouse Irving School of Nursing and became a



registered nurse in 1948, earned her BS in education from Syracuse University in 1957, as well as her MS in Nursing Education in 1975. She was a public health nurse for six years before joining Crouse Hospital School of Nursing where she was a beloved instructor for 35 years. On the 75<sup>th</sup> birthday of the College of Nursing, she spoke to the celebrants and shared her reflections on the nursing profession. We celebrate Helen's rich legacy with these selected excerpts:

*The patient always has and always* will be the focal point of student *learning and behavior. Our history* is one of many changes and many people contributing to its growth. I know of no other profession where comraderie is any closer as nursing is caring and helping each other. No other profession can tell the stories of actual incidents that were any funnier, any more frustrating, any more humiliating or any more rewarding. *Every day, a new occurrence brings* a new story. Each class says to each other, "Do you remember when ....?" This is when we remember those nurses and people who have had a lasting influence on each of us. We are *here to celebrate our* 75<sup>th</sup> *birthday, to* recognize that each and every one has contributed to the school's growth and reputation and to offer our assistance to the growth of a tried and true profession. Let us recognize those who have made our school the great institution that it is and do our best to uphold its reputation and tradition."
