It's been nearly five months since I assumed the role of CEO for Crouse Hospital – and it's been a very smooth transition. Dr. Kronenberg has been – and continues to be – right there for me with advice, answers to my many questions and all-around support, which has been greatly appreciated.

I have been getting out and about as much as possible, meeting with employees, physicians and patients, getting an even better 'feel' for what makes this hospital so great. I have greatly enjoyed shadowing physicians as they make patient rounds and have spent time in the ER, ICU, radiology and other areas over the past several weeks.

Crouse continues to be a very busy hospital, and this is reflected in our financial performance through the first quarter of the year. We are ahead of budget, with revenue slightly higher than what we projected, and expenses a bit lower than budgeted. This is a good balance and our goal is to keep that going all year.

We continue to stay focused on several major strategic initiatives: our culture; growing bariatric and robotic surgery; women's services; further developing primary care; and neurosciences development. You'll be hearing more about each of these areas throughout the year.

And speaking of women's services, we are excited about being the only Spirit of Women hospital in CNY.

Reflecting our proud history and strategic focus, the Spirit program educates women and their loved ones about key women's health topics such as weight loss, menopause, cancer, diabetes and heart disease. As a Spirit hospital, Crouse has made a commitment to spread the good news that being a healthy woman is not just about having a great relationship with your healthcare provider, but also about having healthy times with family and friends. We recently introduced the program internally and are planning communitywide launch of the program June 7 at Destiny USA. More to come!

In closing – and on behalf of the entire Senior Leadership team – I thank you for your dedication and commitment to Crouse Hospital and the Crouse College of Nursing. You are a vitally important connection for our organization and we appreciate all you do to help keep Crouse strong in our community.

What's New at the College of Nursing

In January, faculty and staff welcomed a record number 363 new and returning students to our nursing program. This spring, we implemented the third semester of our new concept-based curriculum.

On March 24, nationally recognized expert in nursing education, Donna "Iggy" Ignatavicus presented an all day conference on *Successful Concept Based Curriculum Implementation* at the Marley Education Center. This conference was sponsored by Crouse Hospital Educational Services and the College of Nursing and was well received by all who attended.

Once again, students are making plans to participate in the 3rd annual Global Health Initiative in Guatemala from June 4-13, 2014. Students and faculty are working together to raise funds to support this endeavor. They danced the night away at Latin Dance Night in Early March. They hosted a Cultural Diversity Night on Saturday April 26 at the Marley Education Center. There were ethnic dishes, Irish dancing, bag pipers, belly dancing, henna painting and various cultural activities for the entire family. Endowment Fund/Scholarships Update

The Crouse Health Foundation's Endowment Fund was started through a \$5 million fund-raising campaign in 1983. The principal of the fund is never touched; investment income only is used to purchase equipment and fund programs and services at Crouse Hospital.

In 1988, the Foundation made its first disbursement of investment income back to Crouse Hospital. Today, the market value of the Endowment Fund is approximately \$23 million, net of the more than \$19 million in investment income that has been given back to the Hospital since disbursements started 26 years ago.

In 1999, the Crouse Hospital Nurses Alumni started a named, endowed fund within the Endowment Fund to furnish scholarships for qualified students in the Crouse Hospital College of Nursing. Started through donations totaling \$25,000, the market value of the Crouse Hospital Nurses Alumni Fund (net of all scholarships awarded) now stands at \$97,212 (as of December 31, 2013)

The Crouse Health Foundation's 2014 Endowment Allocation Committee met on April 2nd to distribute a record allocation of \$1,012,000 to high-priority needs at Crouse Hospital. Our thanks go to Joan Greene for representing the Crouse Hospital Nurses Alumni at the meeting. Fifty-eight grants were made that afternoon, and a complete list of the awards can be found at www.crouse.org/aboutus/foundation.html.Sixty scholarships for students in the Crouse Hospital School of Nursing were part of one grant, with sixteen of those scholarships funded through investment income generated by the Crouse Hospital Nurses Alumni Fund. That brings the total number of endowed scholarships funded by the Alumni Association to 72 since the fund started disbursing investment income back in 2000. These endowed scholarships are in addition to the eight annual scholarships (six general and two Elsie Hillen scholarships) funded by Crouse Hospital Nurses Alumni, for a total of 24 scholarships for the 2014-2015 academic year. Recipients of these awards will be selected in July, with at least one going to a current LPN who is working on becoming an RN.

New Computer Lab Funded Entirely by Charitable Gifts

A new 40-computer lab is being planned for the College of Nursing to support our students' classroom work as well as the administration of tests. The lab will be housed in a renovated classroom on the third floor of the Marley Education Center, and it will feature state-of-the-art hardware, software and furniture. More than \$60,000 was needed to make this project a reality, and it has been funded entirely through donor support including an anonymous gift, a grant from the Crouse Hospital Medical Staff, and estate gifts from three College of Nursing alumni.

SADA Charity Preview

The 2014 Syracuse Auto Dealers Association (SADA) Charity Preview was held on Wednesday, February 12 at the Pirro Convention Center at Oncenter in Syracuse. Crouse was one of 13 charities that benefited from this year's SADA preview, and 100% of proceeds from the tickets sold by Crouse came back to our organization. Proceeds exceeded \$22,000 and most of these monies are now being used to purchase instrumentation for Crouse Hospital's Robotic Surgery Program. Additionally, about \$7,000 went to support the College of Nursing's new computer lab.
