In early 2016, Pomeroy College of Nursing Alumnus **Karl Schindler** (Class of '15) worked with the Crouse Health Foundation and College leadership to establish the "Spirit of Nursing Award." Funded through his first paycheck as an RN, Karl wanted the award to be given to a female student in her last semester who was also a single parent. This was Karl's way of paying tribute to the strong



female role models who inspired him throughout his nursing education and his life. Since the first "Spirit of Nursing Award" was presented in spring 2016, Karl has continued to fund this special recognition, and this year's recipient is student Chrystal Behm. Chrystal started her career in healthcare as a certified nursing assistant and then as an LPN. She is now part of the first cohort graduating this May from our College's "18-months to RN" evening program, and she is excited to both achieve her long-time dream of becoming an RN and be recognized by this award. As Chrystal noted upon notification of her selection, "I truly feel that throughout the years, I have been blessed by my patients thinking I was blessing them. Nursing to me is the holistic care of the patient...it's the care of the body, heart, mind and soul. While I knew continuing my education as a single mother was going to be extremely difficult, I wanted to be able to show my daughter anything is possible." Congratulations to John Rankin, RN, Wound and Ostomy Nursing, **Class of 2014** who was selected for the November 2017 Daisy Award. John was nominated for his knowledge and compassion toward a patient who was facing a lifestyle change related to a diagnosis of rectal cancer. For this grateful patient and his wife, John reassured them that he would leave his cell phone on over the weekend so that they could call if they experienced trouble with the ileostomy following discharge. The grateful wife wrote, "John is a nurse who goes beyond what is necessary to assure his patient's confidence emotionally and physically. He is an outstanding employee of Crouse Hospital and we hope he will be recognized for his dedication to his profession and meeting the needs of his patients."

Christol Jennings, RN, Class of 2010, was selected as the **September 2017** Daisy Honoree. The patient's mother wrote in her nomination, "My son who is special needs was transferred from the ICU to the 6th floor North to recover from a critical infection and rash. Our nurse, Christol, took complete interest in my son's well-being. She noted his arms were quite swollen from so much IV fluids. She told me she wanted to order an ultrasound to rule out any blood clots. I agreed. The result was a clot was found in his left arm and he was immediately put on a thinner. I commend Christol for being so "on board" and interested in his case. The results could have been life threatening. I am so grateful for her presence of mind and trying to do everything and anything for the benefit and care of my son. Christol is a great asset to Crouse and also a wonderful and cheerful person! of Nursing at Crouse Hospital, thanks to the generosity of alumna Helen Klinko Mangan (Class of 1948) and her husband, Dr. Albert F. Mangan.

Helen Klinko was born in Ithaca in 1926. After attending the Crouse-Irving School of Nursing, Helen worked as a rural public health nurse in upstate New York. Albert Mangan, a native of Sherrill, NY, graduated from the NYS College of Forestry at Syracuse University before entering the military in 1942. After discharge, he worked for a timber company before returning to Syracuse to earn his medical degree.

The couple met here in central New York and, after marrying in 1953, moved to Seattle where Albert did his Family Practice residency. When he opened his medical practice in Port Angeles, WA, Helen became the office manager and, together, they worked and volunteered in their community.

Helen passed away in 2012 and Albert in 2017. Through their estate, they generously remembered the educational, civic, religious and healthcare organizations that played a role in their lives, including Helen's alma mater, known today as the Pomeroy College of Nursing at Crouse Hospital. Through a residuary bequest of 10% of their estate, the "Dr. Albert and Helen Klinko Mangan (Class of 1948) Scholarship Fund" has been created within the Crouse Health Foundation's endowment fund. The principal of this permanent legacy will not be touched; investment income only will be used each year to award full scholarships to Pomeroy nursing students in honor of the Mangans. We are honored to be the beneficiary and steward of this very generous gift that will greatly impact the education of our students and the future of the nursing profession.

Pomeroy College of Nursing Scholarships

Through the generous support of the Crouse Hospital Nurses Alumni, fifteen scholarships totaling \$7,500 are now being awarded to students who are either currently in our program or have been accepted to the Pomeroy College of Nursing to start in fall 2018. These awards came from investment income earned by the endowed Crouse Hospital Nurses Alumni Fund, and recipients were selected by the school based on academic achievement and financial need. At the request of the alumni association board, up to two of these scholarships have been specifically earmarked for LPNs who are continuing their education to become RNs. In January, another eight scholarships will be awarded for the 2019 calendar year in the name of Crouse Hospital Nurses Alumni from an outright donation of \$5,000 made by the association. These "split" scholarship disbursements - academic year versus calendar year - represent the College's goal to have monies available for students entering our program in both the fall and spring semesters. Our students are deeply grateful for this meaningful support, and our heartfelt thanks go to all the alumni whose continued involvement and generosity make these awards possible.








Congratulations, Graduates!

Sharing our Yearbooks and Photographs through Digitization

The Library staff has been busy digitizing photographs and yearbooks preserved and stored in the Crouse Health Archives collections. As the recipient of a grant from the Central Library Resources Council (CLRC), we have so far digitized 170 photographs and 18 yearbooks. This project involves utilizing the expert services of CLRC and hiring a professionally trained librarian, Alison Churchill, who describes each item using what is called "metadata," which makes each photograph and/or yearbook discoverable and searchable. To date, fourteen yearbooks from Crouse-Irving Hospital and Crouse-Irving Memorial Hospital Schools of Nursing have been scanned and described. Upon the completion of the grant (June, 2018), the yearbooks will go live on the New York Heritage website (www.nyheritage.org). Keep your eyes open for the launching of these new items in the Crouse Health collection on New York Heritage.

New York Heritage provides a portal for learning about the people, places and events that contributed to the making of New York State. Through our participation in the New York Heritage project, we can, for the first time, share widely with our alumni, friends, families, researchers and the community, the treasures and memories of the nursing school experience here at Crouse. Moreover, we are able to visually tell the story of the place that Crouse holds in the history and development of professional nursing and nursing



education.
