There are many exciting things happening at Pomeroy College of Nursing as we begin a new academic year. We recently welcomed 73 new students to our traditional, weekday program. They are settling into their classes now and have started their first clinical experiences at the Hospital. I love the energy and excitement that a new cohort of students brings to our campus.

Our "Degree in Three" students started this semester at Le Moyne College. We look forward to welcoming twenty students to our campus in January. These students will earn an associate degree from Pomeroy College of Nursing and a bachelor's degree from Le Moyne in three (3) years.

We received approval in early September from the NY State Education Department to revise our curriculum. We are now offering our Evening/Weekend option in 16 months. This program option allows students with daytime commitments to pursue their nursing education with convenient evening classes. They will attend classes and clinical four evenings a week, Monday through Thursday. Fridays are open for student support services, meetings with faculty, skills practice or studying with peers. We believe this format is advantageous for students and will help increase the number of nurses in our community. Finally, College administration, faculty, staff and students are participating in a team activity this fall to help the homeless in our area. There are many exciting new changes and additions at Crouse, from new technology to achievements, as well as three new doctors who have begun seeing patients.

Crouse Medical Practice recently welcomed three new doctors: Jorge Eller, MD; Viren Kaul, MD and Paraskos Araouzos, MD. Dr. Eller is a board-

certified, fellowship-trained cerebrovascular and endovascular neurosurgeon who joins the Crouse Neurosciences team. Dr. Kaul is board-certified in pulmonology and critical care medicine and will see patients at Crouse Medical Practice as well as serve as a member of the Critical Care Medicine team at Crouse Hospital. Dr. Araouzos, known to patients as “Dr. Perry,” is a board-certified family medicine doctor who will see patients in the Manilius office of Crouse Medical Practice. We welcome them all to the Crouse family!

At the hospital, we recently invested \$2.5 million in the upgrade of our Pediatric Cardiac Catheterization Suite, located in our Miron Cardiac Care Center. Crouse is home to the region's only pediatric catheterization program, a partnership with Syracuse-based Pediatric Cardiology Associates that provides life-saving cardiac care to more than 150 infants, young children and teens annually. Work on the upgraded suite includes a new, next generation Phillips cardiac biplane system, as well as new lighting and increased square footage. The project is expected to be completed in November.

Additional upgrades in the hospital include a new Hologic 3D Breast Biopsy Prone System in our Dr. Hadley J. Falk Breast Health Center, which is designed to provide more accurate diagnoses with patients' physical and emotional comfort at the forefront. During the needle biopsy, the patient is prone, or laying down, instead of sitting or standing. Crouse Imaging

Services has also unveiled a new, upgraded MRI system, which uses 35 percent less power than previous generation MRI systems and provides enhanced imaging quality in less time to better meet the needs of our patients and their physicians.

Crouse is also pleased to announce that we've earned the number 20 spot among the 50 employers in NYS best-liked by their workers, as compiled in a new study released today by Forbes. This encompasses our 3,150 employees at Crouse Hospital, Crouse Medical Practice, Crouse Health Foundation and the Pomeroy College of Nursing, plus our dedicated providers and volunteers.



U.S. News & World Report has recognized Crouse as a 'Top Hospital' in New York State. The publication ranked Crouse as number 25 in the state and number two in the Syracuse area, nationally ranked for heart failure, colon cancer surgery and hip replacement surgery.



In June, Crouse received the Earl G. Graves Corporate Award from the NAACP of Syracuse and Onondaga County. Crouse President and CEO Kimberly Boynton said: “We feel that our commitment to diversity and inclusion, while still in its infancy, represents a key differentiator for Crouse Health in our community. In fact, the work we have done, and the early progress we have made — as recognized by the NAACP — has become an integral part of the Crouse culture, which extends not only to our employees house wide, but to our patients and visitors as well.”

animals; she has 3 dogs, barn cats, chickens, bunnies and a pig. She loves to garden and plants both flowers and vegetables.



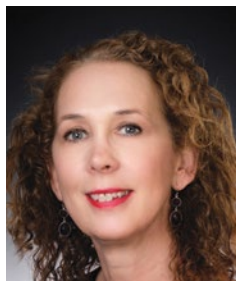

shift "knows everything" about them. Liz has been a fixture on 6N for many, many years and if you look close enough her name, one of many, is engraved in the foundation of 6N.

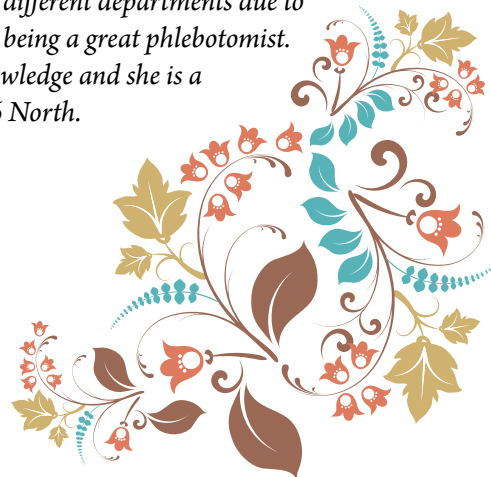

Alumna has Lasting Impact on Her Alma Mater and the Nursing Profession

In February of this year, Alumna Wanda D. Van Arsdale (Class of 1951) passed away.

Wanda's life story is one of hard work and a dream fulfilled, thanks to the encouragement of her family and friends.

She grew up on a farm in Pulaski, NY and knew she wanted to be a nurse before she graduated high school in 1946. "One evening, while I was helping my father feed the cows, I told



him that I wanted to be a nurse. He immediately said, 'Wanda, there is nothing else I would rather have you be.' That was all the encouragement I needed." Wanda first worked in an office to save \$1,000 to cover tuition, fees, uniforms and books at the then Crouse-Irving School of Nursing.

After graduation, she worked in the surgical practice of Drs. A.J. and Lyman Spire; she loved being a surgical nurse but eventually left to work part-time in Crouse's Emergency Room so she could pursue her BSN degree at Syracuse University. In 1961, she became a nursing instructor at Crouse; she "retired" in 1986 but continued to work part-time until 1992.

For many years, Wanda served on the Crouse Hospital Nurses Alumni Board, overseeing the production of the newsletter in addition to other responsibilities. She also volunteered in the office of today's Pomeroy College of Nursing. Throughout her adult life, Wanda had an impact on the future of the nursing profession through her work as an instructor and her support of the scholarships funded by Crouse Hospital Nurses Alumni.

Toward the end of her life, Wanda made plans to bequeath assets from her estate to create a permanent fund within the Crouse Health Foundation that would provide ongoing support for Crouse Hospital and scholarships for Pomeroy College of Nursing students. Although no longer with us, Wanda's love of the Crouse organization and the nursing profession will continue for perpetuity through the Wanda D. Van Arsdale Endowment Fund.

Pomeroy College of Nursing Scholarships

Through the generous support of Crouse Hospital Nurses Alumni, sixteen scholarships totaling \$8,000 were recently given to Pomeroy College of Nursing students for the 2019-2020 academic year. These awards came from investment

income earned by the endowed Crouse Hospital Nurses Alumni Fund, and recipients were selected by the school based on academic achievement and financial need. In January, another eight scholarships will be awarded for the 2020 calendar year in the name of Crouse Hospital Nurses Alumni from an outright donation of \$5,000 made by the association. These "split" scholarship disbursements – academic year versus calendar year – represent the College's goal to have monies available for students entering our program in both the fall and spring semesters. Our students are deeply grateful for this meaningful support, and our heartfelt thanks go to all the alumni whose continued involvement and generosity make these awards possible.

In addition to staying busy I am also in the United States Marine Reserves. It has been a great experience, I've been afforded opportunities to train in the Mojave Desert. In addition, I've trained in Norway with multiple foreign countries this past fall.

She attended to our comfort needs while we took turns at Mom's bedside and rotated overnight stays. She always made sure we were taken care of as well, while also giving us privacy."

Loretta Mitchell, Class of 2008, is Crouse Health's August 2019 Daisy Award Recipient. Loretta has the distinct honor of having been nominated three times in one month. The first nomination was from a patient who had knee revision surgery. He said Loretta was diligent in explaining medication and understanding his pain level. The second nomination was from a patient who was only in the hospital for less than 24 hours but was very appreciative of her calm, sweet and encouraging nature. Lastly, Loretta was nominated by a patient for whom she cared twice; once in 2008 and again this year. "Loretta is highly skilled and her depth of knowledge is evident. My family and I are grateful," this patient wrote.
