aren Visco and Ryan Hunter married in 2017 and two years later - after experiencing fertility challenges were ecstatic to find themselves expecting their first child, Jackson.

But Jackson's entry into the world didn't go as planned. In June 2019, Karen and Ryan were visiting family in Syracuse when Karen's water unexpectedly broke when she was just 26 weeks pregnant. "I called my doctor and was told to go to the hospital immediately. Luckily, a doctor at our family gathering recommended Crouse Hospital's level four NICU," Karen shared.

Karen and Ryan's weekend trip from their home in New York City turned into a nearly two-month stay. On June 29, two weeks after Karen was admitted, Jackson was born, weighing 3 pounds. He was immediately transferred to the NICU and was treated with antibiotics and a blood transfusion. Jackson remained in the Crouse NICU for the next five weeks before being transferred to a NICU closer to their home. The Hunters were able to bring Jackson home on August 23, 10 weeks after Karen's



water broke. "All the NICU nurses were wonderful," Karen said.

"I was by Jackson's bedside at least eight hours every day. We were away from home; it was a very challenging time. But the doctors and nurses were so supportive and kind and made us comfortable and confident in Jackson's treatment."

"Even in such a trying time, we had such a great experience," Ryan added.

"The NICU nurses decorated and hung a sign for Jackson on his isolette. Dr. Gross and all the staff were so kind. They went above and beyond, not just as healthcare professionals but as caring people."

Now, Jackson is a happy and healthy 4-year-old boy, and Karen and Ryan are forever grateful to the medical staff at Crouse Hospital. They choose to give back to the hospital by supporting the Crouse Health Foundation.

CROUSE HISTORY - A LOOK BACK AT 1983

n the Spring of 1983, "A Commitment to Excellence" was selected as the theme of the original endowment fund campaign at what was then called Crouse Irving Memorial Hospital.

Initially, the campaign was created to establish a fund so the hospital would be able to use the interest earned from invested principal to purchase medical equipment. The goal was set at \$5 million. By the fall of 1983, more than half of the original goal was reached through donations from the medical staff, employees, foundation and hospital boards, auxiliary, and nursing school alumni of Crouse.

What was once simply going to be a campaign to raise money for medical equipment, became the establishment of what we now know as our Crouse Health Foundation Endowment Fund.

Today the fund has a market value of almost \$31 million. The principal of the fund remains untouched, while a portion of the investment income earned annually is given to Crouse Hospital.

Investment income disbursements began in 1988, and monies awarded in support of the hospital to date total almost \$34 million.



In 2022, the Foundation's Board of Trustees allocated more than \$1.3 million in investment income earned by the Endowment Fund, distributed through more than 50 grants for various programs and services of the hospital.

Because an endowment gift will be invested permanently, it can serve as a permanent tribute to the donor and extend the donor's values for future generations. Your donation today will help ensure the viability of Crouse to care for your family for generations to come.

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"We're fortunate to be in a position to give," Ryan said. "So many people have similar - or more challenging - stories and experiences. We want to help ensure the great people at Crouse can continue to provide their first-rate services today and to future generations."

Karen and Ryan make annual donations to Crouse and contribute to the Crouse Classic Golf Tournament every July. "It's a great opportunity to return to Syracuse and spend time with family, friends and the fine folks at Crouse and the Foundation," Ryan shared.

Last year, Karen and Ryan also welcomed Jackson's brother, Grayson, to the family. In their spare time, the Hunters love to travel, play and coach kickball and volunteer for the parents' association at Jackson's preschool.

"We're grateful for the opportunity to give


